Guidance Notes for Delegates

What to do on Arrival

We look forward to welcoming you to Queens' College, Cambridge. Please enter via the Porters' Lodge on Silver Street beside the Mathematical Bridge (pictured below).



If you are staying in College you should collect your keys from the Porters' Lodge. They will direct you to your room and provide you with a wifi code.

Please note the word 'porter' comes from the Latin for 'gate', and they are not there to help you with your bags.

Accommodation in College

The rooms are relatively basic. Coffee and tea making facilities are provided, however, there is no television. The principal advantage is that the rooms are close to where the Conference is held so you will be on the spot throughout.

Food in College

Food is provided as indicated in the Conference programme. If you are staying longer you will also be able to get breakfast since this is included in the price of the room but please note that outside the Conference itself food is not provided for lunch or dinner.

Saturday Lunch is included for all registered delegates. Guests of registered delegates should pay at the cash register.

Many will want to explore the restaurants nearby. If you walk up Silver Street to the junction with Trumpington Street and turn left, walk past Corpus and turn right at the Grasshopper Clock you will find Benet Street which is lined with pubs and restaurants to suit all tastes. Closer to the college, the Anchor and Mill pubs serve food, and there are many others close by.

Conference Registration

You won't be able to register for the conference until Friday morning. At registration you can pick up your copy of the final programme (if you haven't downloaded it from the website), and a conference badge. Please wear this throughout the Conference as it indicates you are a registered delegate.

Volunteers are manning the reception desk in the mornings to answer any questions.

Coffee and Tea and Merchandise Stalls

Tea and coffee will be served in the bar area in Lion Court throughout the Conference where there will also be a stall manned by Lewis Masonic. This is the heart of the Conference and will be clearly marked

The bar will be open on Friday evening and after the gala dinner on Saturday night.
